#### Climate

Tanzania's climate varies across its regions, influenced by altitude, geography, and proximity to the coast, creating a blend of tropical and temperate conditions. Generally, the country experiences two main seasons: the dry season and the rainy season.

Dry Season (June to October):

The dry season is Tanzania's cooler period, with clear skies and minimal rainfall. Temperatures range from 20°C to 30°C (68°F to 86°F), depending on the region. This is the best time for wildlife viewing, as animals gather around water sources and vegetation is sparse, making them easier to spot.

Short Rains (November to December):

The short rains, known locally as "Vuli," bring light, sporadic showers, primarily in the northern and coastal regions. The landscape transforms into lush greenery, but the rains are brief and often followed by sunshine.

Wet Season (March to May):

The wet season, or "Masika," brings heavy, consistent rains, particularly in the southern and central regions. Temperatures rise, ranging from 25°C to 32°C (77°F to 90°F), with high humidity, especially along the coast. This is a vibrant time for birdwatching, as migratory species thrive, and the landscape is at its most fertile.

Year-Round Coastal Climate:

The coastal areas, including Rufiji, Dar es Salaam, and the Indian Ocean islands, enjoy a humid tropical climate year-round, with temperatures between 25°C and 35°C (77°F to 95°F).

Tanzania's varied climate ensures a dynamic experience throughout the year, from dry, wildlife-rich savannahs to rain-fed green landscapes teeming with life.



When planning a trip to Tanzania, it's essential to be aware of the health requirements and recommendations to ensure a safe and healthy visit

Health authorities recommend the following vaccinations for travelers to Tanzania:

- Hepatitis A: Advised for most travelers due to potential exposure through contaminated food or water.
- Typhoid: Recommended for those visiting smaller cities or rural areas where sanitation may be compromised.
- Hepatitis B: Suggested for travelers who might have close contact with locals, require medical procedures, or engage in activities that increase exposure risk.
- Rabies: Considered for those who may have direct contact with animals or are visiting remote areas where medical care is limited.
- Meningitis: Recommended, particularly during the dry season when the risk is higher.
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR): Ensure vaccinations are current, as outbreaks can occur.
- Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap): A booster is advised if not received in the last ten years.
- Polio: An additional adult booster is recommended due to increased global cases
- COVID-19 Guidelines: All travelers entering or transiting through Tanzania must be fully vaccinated against COVID-19. While specific entry requirements may change, it's prudent to carry proof of vaccination and stay informed about the latest guidelines from official sources.



#### **Entry Requirements**


To enter Tanzania, ensure your passport is valid for at least six months beyond your stay. Most travelers need a visa, which can be obtained in advance or on arrival.




#### Insurance

Travelers to Tanzania are strongly advised to secure comprehensive travel insurance that includes the following:

- Medical Coverage: Ensure the policy covers medical treatment, hospitalization, and emergency evacuation, as healthcare facilities outside major cities may be limited.
- Flying Doctor Insurance: This is particularly important in remote areas where medical
  facilities may be far away. Flying doctor services offer emergency medical evacuation
  by air, ensuring prompt treatment in case of serious illness or injury.
- Lost or Stolen Items: Coverage for baggage, personal belongings, and important documents like passports.



## **Hunting Information**

#### Fiirearms & Ammunition regulations

We recommend bringing the firearms you are most familiar with for your hunting safari in Tanzania. You are allowed to import up to three firearms for your safari; however, handguns, as well as automatic and semi-automatic weapons, are strictly prohibited.

For dangerous game hunting, we recommend calibers such as .375 H&H Magnum, .416 Rigby, and .470 Express. For plains game hunting, long-range shooting with telescopic sights is advised.

You may import up to 200 cartridges per caliber or gauge, which is more than sufficient for your safari. Please ensure you bring your own ammunition.

When traveling by air, firearms and ammunition must be checked in. Firearms should be securely cased and unloaded, with ammunition packed separately. It is essential to inform your airline in advance that you will be traveling with firearms and ammunition. Each airline has specific regulations regarding weight limits and packaging requirements, so we strongly recommend verifying their policies when booking your flight.



#### **Cites Permit**

A CITES permit must be obtained from your country of residence or the country where your trophies will be shipped for the species you intend to hunt.

Please note that Sunset Tarangire Ltd is not responsible for obtaining CITES or any other import permits required for your final destination.

#### **Tanzania Hunting Regulations**

The Tanzania Wildlife Department permits the hunting of lions and leopards under the following conditions:

#### 21-Day Safari Permits: -

- 1:1 Guided Hunt One permit allows the hunting of 1 lion and 1 leopard.
- 2:1 Guided Hunt One permit allows the hunting of 1 lion and 1 leopard, which must be shared between both hunters.

#### Legal Size Requirements: -

- Leopard: Minimum legal length is 1.5 meters (60 inches) from the tip of the nose to the base of the tail.
- Crocodile: Minimum legal length is 3 meters (118 inches) from the tip of the nose to the tip of the tail.

#### Species Permitted on a 21-Day License: -

Hunters on a 21-day license are permitted to hunt the following species:

Lion, Leopard, Oryx, Greater Kudu, Eland, Gerenuk, Sable, Ostrich, Klipspringer, Hippopotamus, Roan, Lesser Kudu, Dik Dik, and Porcupine.

#### **Booking Conditions**

To confirm your safari booking, a 50% deposit of the total safari rate is required.

Please note that Game Trophy Fees and Government Royalties will be charged according to the rates applicable in the year your safari takes place, regardless of the amounts quoted in the initial contract.

All invoices and quotes are subject to change at any time due to adjustments in Government fees, taxes, or Game Trophy Fees, which are beyond our control.

#### **Cancellations**

Cancellations made 90 days before the hunt will incur a 20% deduction, while those made 30 days prior will incur a 70% deduction. In cases of Force Majeure—including natural disasters, war, civil unrest, or government intervention, our team may modify or cancel itineraries. Refunds will be provided where possible.



## Anti-Poaching

Sunset Tarangire Ltd is dedicated to protecting Tanzania's wildlife through a proactive anti-poaching strategy. Working closely with the Wildlife Management Area (WMA) Anti-Poaching Department, Tanzania Wildlife Management Authority (TAWA), and the Police Tanzania, we combine intelligence, rapid response, and community engagement to combat poaching effectively.

Our Informant Network provides real-time intelligence on potential threats, allowing our ground force to intercept and prevent illegal activities swiftly. Local communities play a key role in our strategy, and we foster strong relationships by supporting infrastructure, employment, and shared responsibility, reducing the incentive for poaching.

During the 2024/2025 season, Sunset Tarangire Ltd made significant strides in its ongoing efforts to combat poaching within our hunting blocks of Irkiushiobor (Maasai Land) and Tapika (Selous Area). Through dedicated patrols and close collaboration with local authorities, our anti-poaching team successfully apprehended over **30 poachers**, all of whom are currently in custody awaiting prosecution.



Among the confiscated items were more than seven guns (heavy-caliber firearms) used for illegal hunting activities. Unfortunately, our team also discovered several distressing scenes of wild animals were found dead, others severely injured, and some left to decay deep in the bush. These incidents underscore the brutality of poaching, but also reaffirm our commitment to protecting wildlife and preserving the integrity of Tanzania's natural heritage. Sunset Tarangire Ltd remains fully engaged in strengthening surveillance, intelligence gathering, and rapid response initiatives to ensure our hunting blocks remain safe and ethically managed.


## Community Development

As part of its ongoing commitment to community development, Sunset Tarangire Ltd successfully constructed eight classrooms at Rufiji Primary School, marking a major milestone in a broader plan to build a total of 20 classrooms. This long-term project reflects our dedication to fostering sustainable development and securing a brighter future for the children of Rufiji.


